


LAWN MOWER THANK YOU'S

Red Bird Mission

Thank you for your past support of Red Bird Mission. Last year Upper New York sent over 2800 shoeboxes, over 100 new sheet sets and bedspreads, as well as numerous books, school supplies, and cleaning supplies to Red Bird Mission in Beverly, KY. Red Bird Missionary Conference is one of three United Methodist missionary conferences in the United States.

The need is even greater this year.

Our goal for 2023 is to transport at least 3.500 shoeboxes and other supplies to the Red Bird Mission the last week of November.

There are two different styles of shoeboxes-adult and children.

Shoebox items should be put in clear plastic shoeboxsized storage containers with locking lids.

Do not wrap the shoeboxes.

Clearly label each shoebox so they know who the intended recipient is for the items.

Shoeboxes, content list and box labels are available in the church lobby.

Return shoeboxes to church by Nov 19 to allow time for pickup and delivery.

Donations are needed to cover the cost of renting two trucks to deliver the supplies to the Red Bird Mission.

Mission and Outreach

My morning reading today was from Philippians 4. The recipients of the letter are being commended for supporting Paul's needs. Verse 4: "Those gifts give off a fragrant aroma, an acceptable sacrifice that pleases God."

This caused me to think about the fragrant aromas that will be filing our homes on Thanksgiving Day, the roasting turkey, pies, etc.

We might take our sense of smell for granted, but it is of great value. It can trigger a rush of memories. "Odors take a direct route to the limbic system...the regions related to emotion and memory." News.harvard.edu.

When I first used lemon scented Soft Scrub each time I cleaned the bathtub, I had a sense of nostalgia. It took me weeks to identify the memory it triggered. The lemon scent was taking me back to nursing school days, splashing on Jean Nate' while getting ready to go to work on the wards in the summer.

God's promise to never again destroy all living creatures was inspired by the pleasing scent of Noah's burning sacrifice. There are several references to burning sacrifices and giving flour, oil and wine as a pleasing sacrifice to the Lord.

We no longer need to burn sacrifices but you are providing a sweet aroma to God and others as you give of your finances to those in need and of your time coordinating and supporting turkey dinner, painting lines in the parking lot, preparing for Children's Moment, Sunday School, the sermon, communion prep, clean up after coffee hour, participating in leadership positions and all the other ways you

contribute to the needs of others.

II Corinthians 2:14 "Thanks be to God, who always leads us in triumph in Christ and manifests through us the sweet aroma of the knowledge of him in every place."

Let us be aware of our sense of smell and our providing a sweet aroma in every place we serve.

Capítal Stewardshíp Campaign Update

As of Wednesday, October 25, we have received \$269,200.00 or 53.84% in pledges towards our \$500,000.00 goal. Of the amount pledged, we have received \$119,057.54 of which \$22,716.23 has been spent

on fabric to reupholster the sanctuary chairs, for the materials and installation of the carpet and baseboard in the lobby, sitting area and halls and for repairs to gutters. Five thousand (\$5,000.00) of this total has been designated for an electronic sign. Pledges continue to be accepted. Even if you haven't made a pledge, donations to the Capital Stewardship Campaign are gratefully accepted.
