A Note from Pastor Todd Worship 101

Why do we worship the way we do? Every congregation is different, yet common themes run through most United Methodist worship services. Many lifelong Methodists don't know why, let alone how everything goes together. If aspects of worship are foreign to us, consider how a visitor or new Christian feels when God leads them to our Rush UMC family?



Several years ago, I started a rotating list of basic worship information that I would cut-and-paste into the bulletin each Sunday. I called it Worship 101.

Here is an updated list:

1. The definition of worship is to gather for the purpose of giving praise and thanksgiving to God. Think: Praise and Thanksgiving
2. Christian worship is patterned after the practices of the early Apostles, as found in Acts 2:46-47. It is a balance of proclaiming the word and celebrating Holy Communion. Think: Word and Table
3. The sermon is crafted and delivered to interpret the proclaimed Word of God. It serves to prompt the congregation to make practical application of the Word to faithful discipleship (following Jesus), spiritual development, and righteous living.
4. We bring to the altar gifts of bread, wine, food, and money. We present our gifts to God with thanksgiving as a reminder that God provides for our every need.
5. Music follows scripture that is read aloud. Music provides a graceful moment for each to reflect upon what was read. Liturgical music is not a performance. It is employing and engaging gifts and talents God has given for the purpose of praise and thanksgiving.
6. Scripture selections are on a three-year cycle, ensuring the proclamation of most significant narratives from the Bible. The Gospels – Matthew, Mark, and Luke – rotate each year, with a sprinkling of the Gospel of John inserted every year.
7. Worship planning is collaborative. The Confirmation Class learned recently that it takes 19 people to plan, create, and lead every worship service for our Rush UMC family!
8. Dominate colors rotate throughout the Christian year. Purple, a royal color, used during Advent and Lent, symbolize waiting, watching, preparing. White, used during Christmas, Easter, All Saints, Baptism, marriage, and at funerals, symbolizes purity, redemption, salvation, new life and joy! Red, symbolizing fire, is used on

Pentecost, celebrating the descent of the Holy Spirit. Green, symbolizing life and vibrancy, is used on ordinary Sundays between special feasts. Black is used on Good Friday to represent death.

9. The celebration of Holy Communion, also known as, Eucharist, is fulfilling Christ's command to eat bread and drink from the cup every time we gather, in remembrance of him. The Great Thanksgiving is a combination of prayers in order and form that began with the first century Church. Only ordained pastors and assigned local pastors are given authority by the Church to celebrate Holy Communion.

10. The celebration of Baptism is what identifies an individual as a Christian, a disciple of Jesus Christ. We recognize God as the one calling each person to baptism. When baptism is celebrated, we fulfill the commission of Jesus to go into all the world and baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

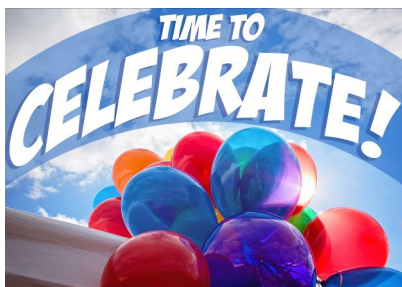
"From Mourning to Joy - The End of COVID19" Save the Date!

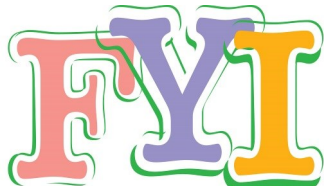
89th Birthday

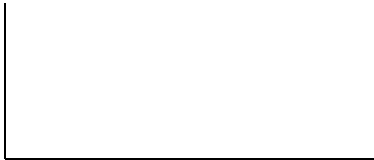
